1. Safe & Disciplined Classrooms - Our Board believes strongly that one of the best supports we can provide our teachers is by making schoolwide discipline and safety a top priority. We have insisted to the Superintendent that we help students understand what the expectations are in this community for positive and appropriate behavior and that we hold them accountable when they don't meet those expectations. We have seen significant improvement in how we handle disciplinary incidents, in what training we provide teachers in classroom management, and how we treat and help students who need extra support. In addition, we have invested heavily in school safety, not only with our police department but also with staff and student training, strong visitor procedures, locked door protocols, and more.

Academic Achievement - Another Board priority is academic performance and providing every opportunity for success for our students. With the changes we've made in the last two years, we have the building blocks in place to see tremendous success going forward. We've made leaps with high-quality curriculum, staffing adjustments, and other partnerships and resources, but we have to stay focused on keeping the bar at a high level and expecting the best OF our students and providing the best FOR our students. This is more than the STAAR test. It's also preparing our students for college or career with opportunities for postsecondary training, internships, and industry certifications. To do this, we have to hire the best teachers possible and then give them the resources they need to do their jobs. Recruiting and retaining high-quality, dedicated teachers is critical to achieving the academic goals we've set

Strengthening Relationships & Partnerships - It's never been more true that our schools can't do it by themselves. They rely on strong relationships, which is why we've outlined collaboration and partnerships as another Board priority. We need and want parents to be involved in the schools and with their child's education. We need and want our local businesses to be visible and present. We need and want mentors to build relationships with kids and be a positive role model for them. Some of the most exciting partnerships we have are industry partnerships that allow our students to have access to job training and the potential of a career after high school for those who don't want to go to college. This is an area we want to continue to highlight and make a priority because it makes a difference for our kids
